## Emergency grant support – a thank you

We could not have achieved half of what we've done without the emergency grant support from Millbrook and Maker-with-Rame parish councils and from Cornwall Community Foundation. Their

generosity allowed us to employ a part-time Key Support worker, now at the heart of our efforts, and to cover our printing and admin costs.

## **Community Survey**

We believe that the virus has caused massive problems for many people's income and well-being. The Peninsula Trust wants to try and help with new support – but to get it right, we have to be clear where the real needs are.

We have created a 2-minute survey and we're asking **everybody to please fill it in**, whether you yourself are affected or not. This will help the Trust understand how wide the need is and how we can help. If you're doing fine, great – please tell us, so we get a full picture for our community.

We are not asking for personal details – it is 100% anonymous.

We'll be publishing the same survey in our next door-to-door newsletter, to reach those without internet (around 25% of older residents, apparently – many of them in the most vulnerable categories).

# One-to-one support for local people

We know that many local people are struggling and worried. Our response:

- We can now offer full one-to-one advice from experienced volunteers, including benefits, housing and debt/budgeting advice. What we don't know ourselves, we can signpost to other specialists.
- We have increased our effort with Liskeard & Looe foodbank and now offer Foodbank vouchers/deliveries directly from the Rame Centre.
- We are providing links to the Rame Community Fund for crisis grants, and other local support.

We know that many people in need won't ask for help. Please talk to your family, friends and neighbours, and convince them to reach out:

"If you're in trouble, ask for help. Willingly given; no stigma; no blame attached."

Our Trust is small and our resources are limited. Unfortunately, this means that our Local Support service is *only available to residents in Millbrook/Cawsand and surrounding hamlets*. We have good contacts for advice services outside our area and can pass those on.

## Food, Phone Chat and more

Our existing effort to support people continues. We're still arranging shopping and deliveries, finding volunteers for those who need something, sending out information, helping with crisis grants and

Foodbank. If you, or someone you know, needs help – ring us.

We've started a Phone Chat service, asking some key volunteers to ring those in need to see how they are getting on. Many people are fine and don't want repeat calls; many others are grateful for the chance to talk, and a few have further needs that we didn't know about. #### **NHS Gift boxes**

We've been running an NHS Gift Box since the early days of the crisis. Community generosity has been overwhelming, with donations of all kinds of Lovely Things, from handcream to chocolates, facemask ties to flannels, as well as locally-made apple juice. Deliveries have gone to Liskeard and Derriford hospitals, Penntorr doctors surgery, Torcare home in Antony and Millbrook Pharmacy. Thanks very much to everyone who has contributed.

#### News from the Ship, Coastguard Cottages, Methodist Hall

Other work by the Trust is continuing behind the scenes:

- The Old Ship in Cawsand is nearing completion of the first phase of building work. For obvious reasons, it won't be opening as a pub/café any time soon, but we are working on a limited opening as a community hub for Cawsand. More on that as soon as we have it.
- Our work to buy the three empty houses at Cawsand Coastguard Cottages has seen even more delays. We were very nearly there just before the virus struck – just one official document away... but that one approval didn't get to us and we're still waiting.
- Millbrook Methodist Hall. Our public consultation
  was complete pre-virus, and we now have outline ideas for a
  potential rebuild for new housing and community space. We
  will come back to the ideas once the coronacrisis work has
  slowed down enough.

We will keep sending out information and support. Stay strong everybody, this will pass!
